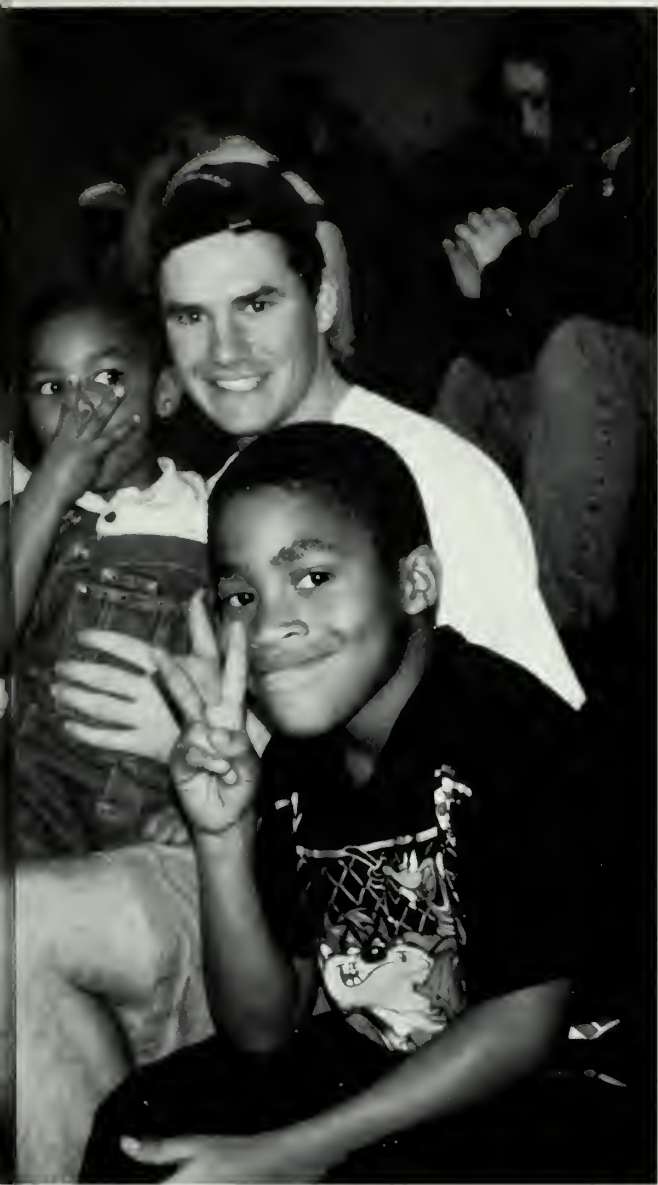

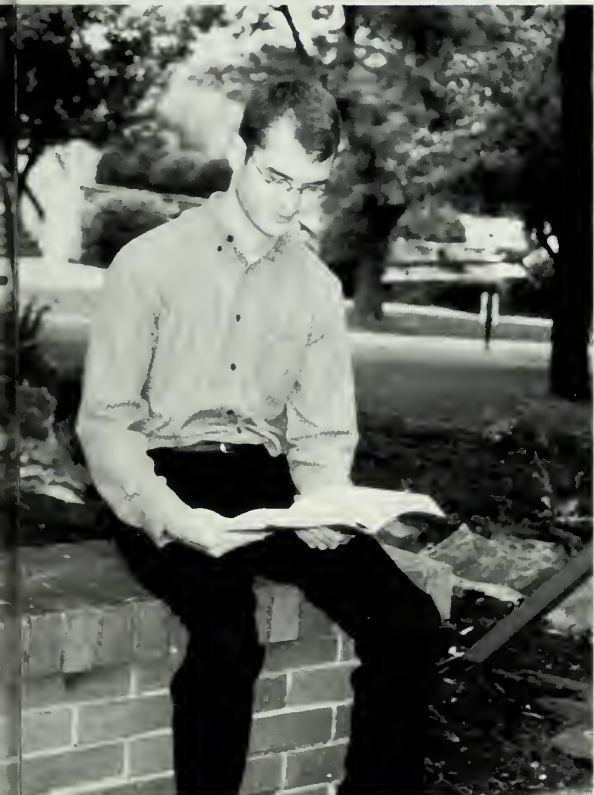

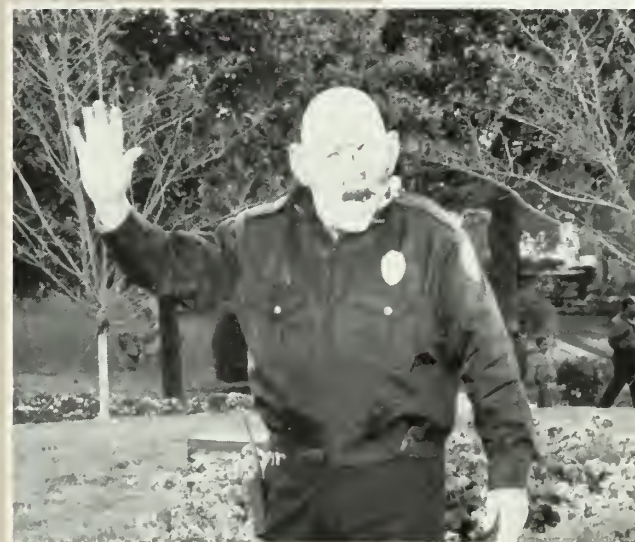

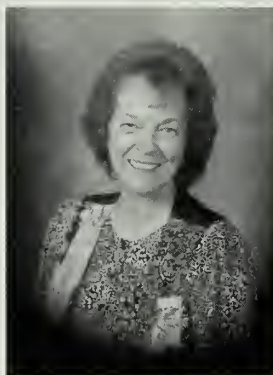

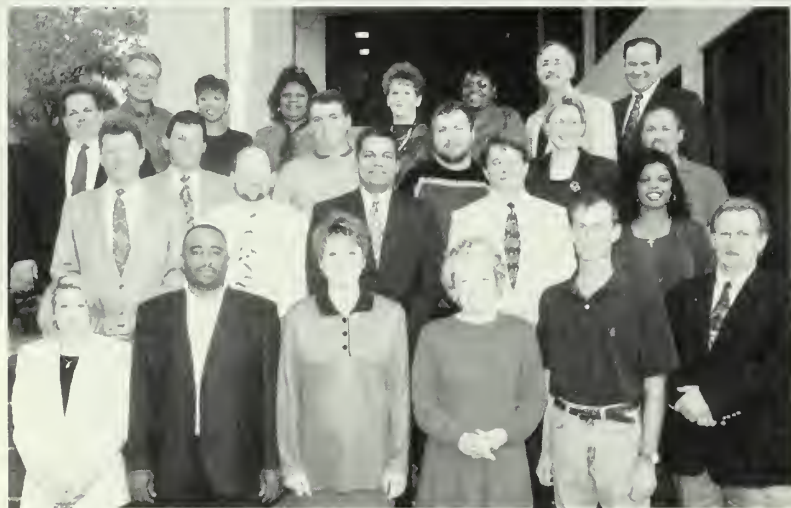

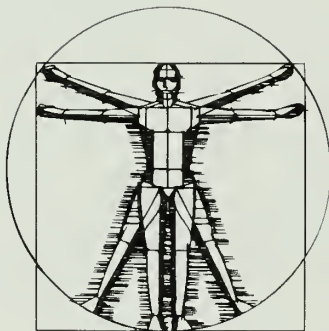

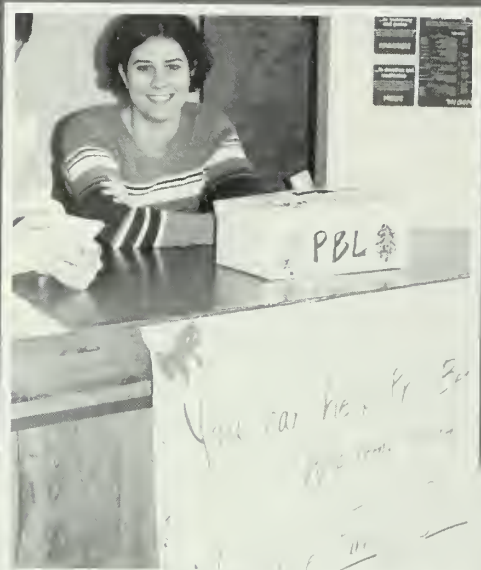

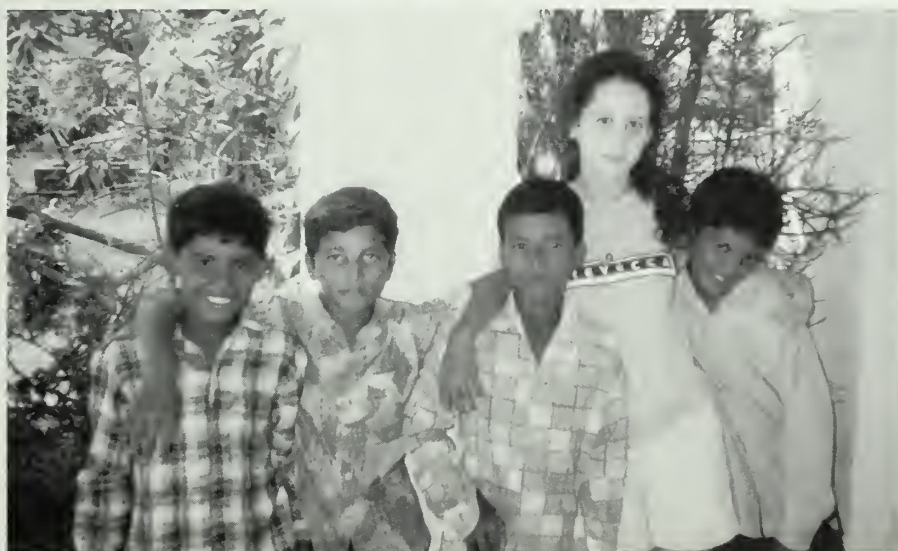

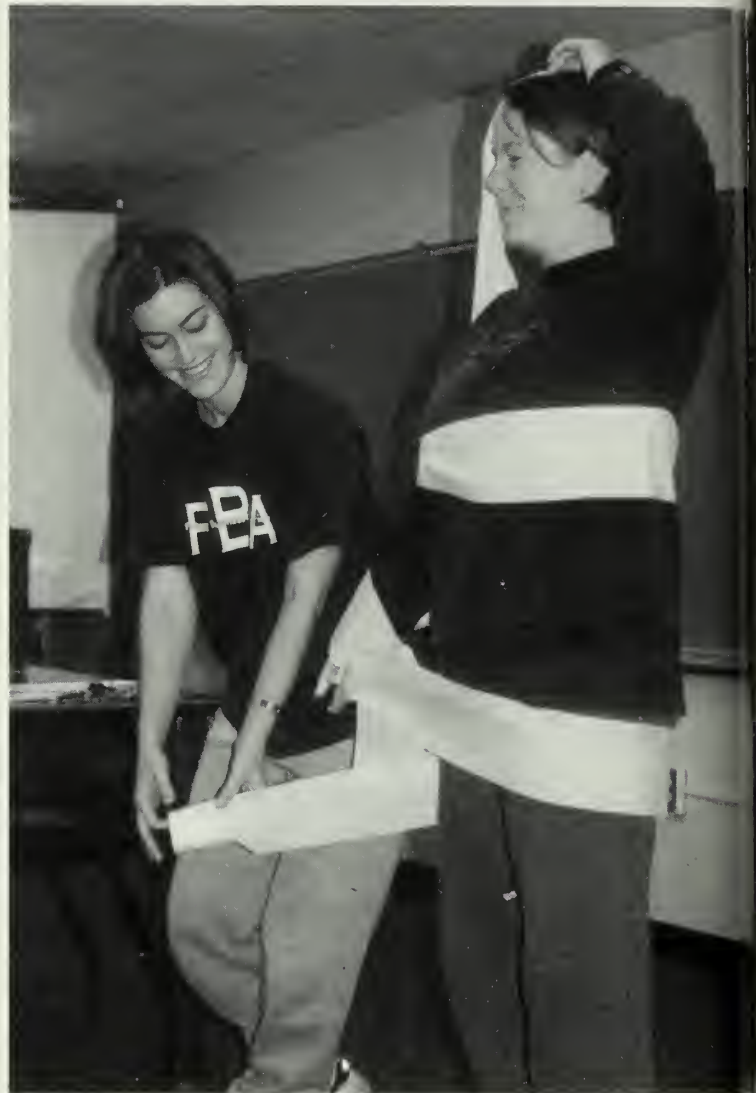

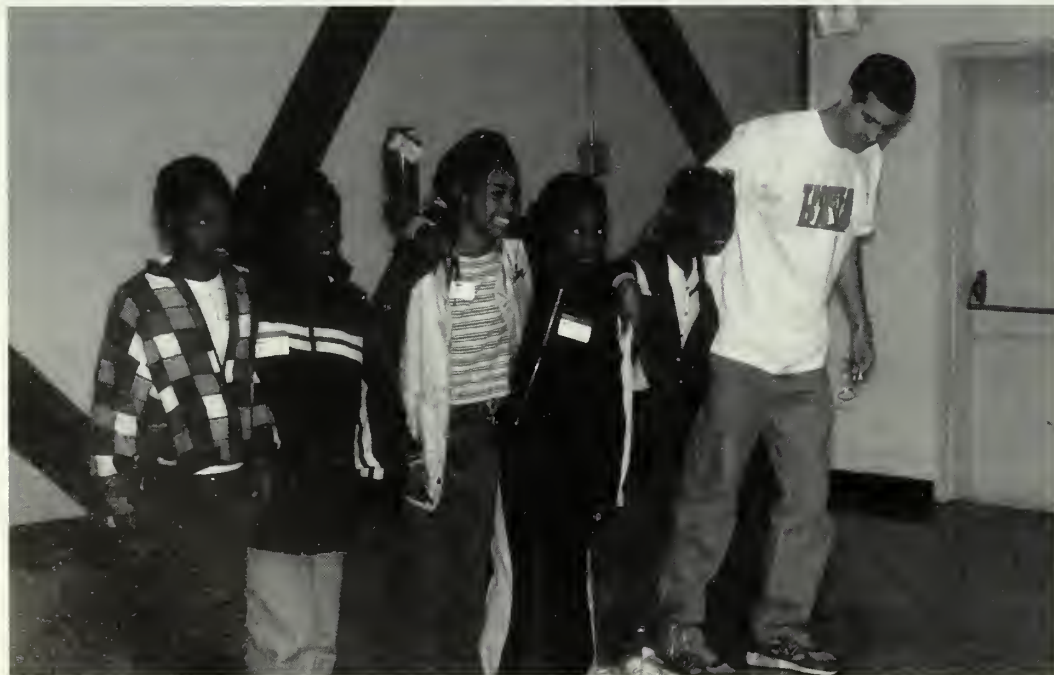

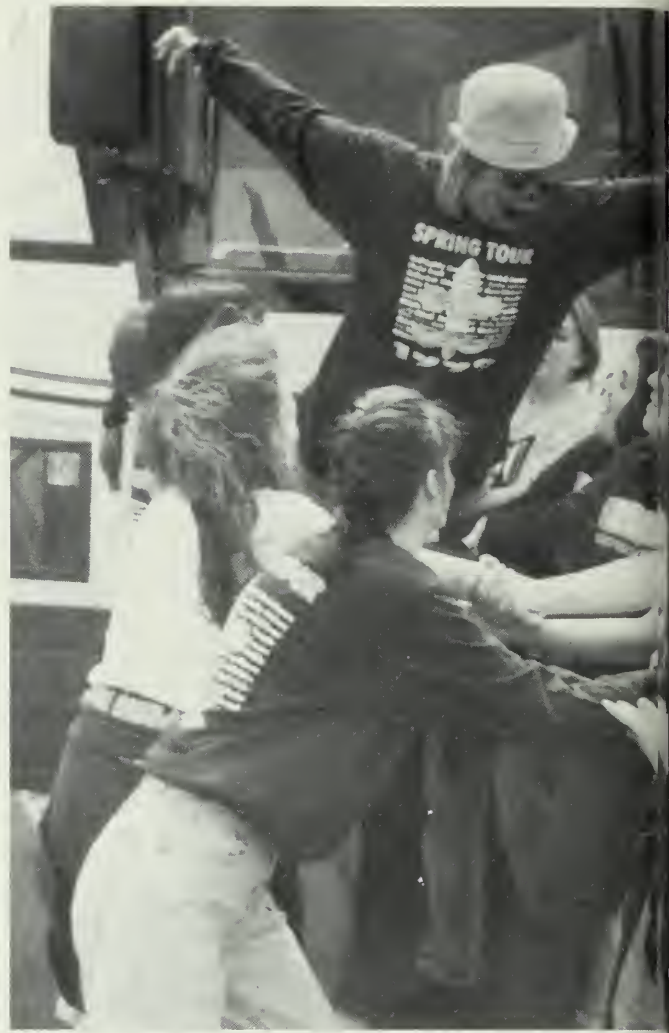

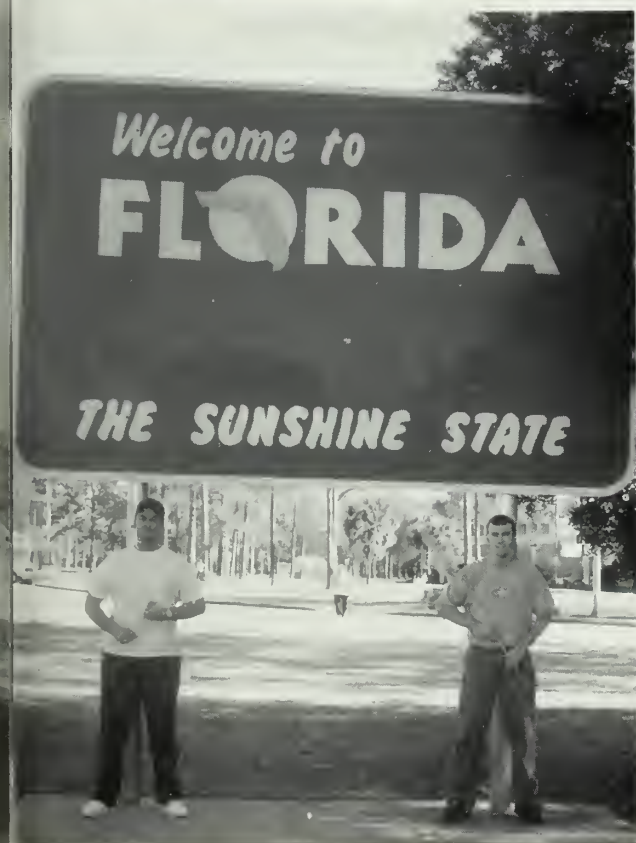

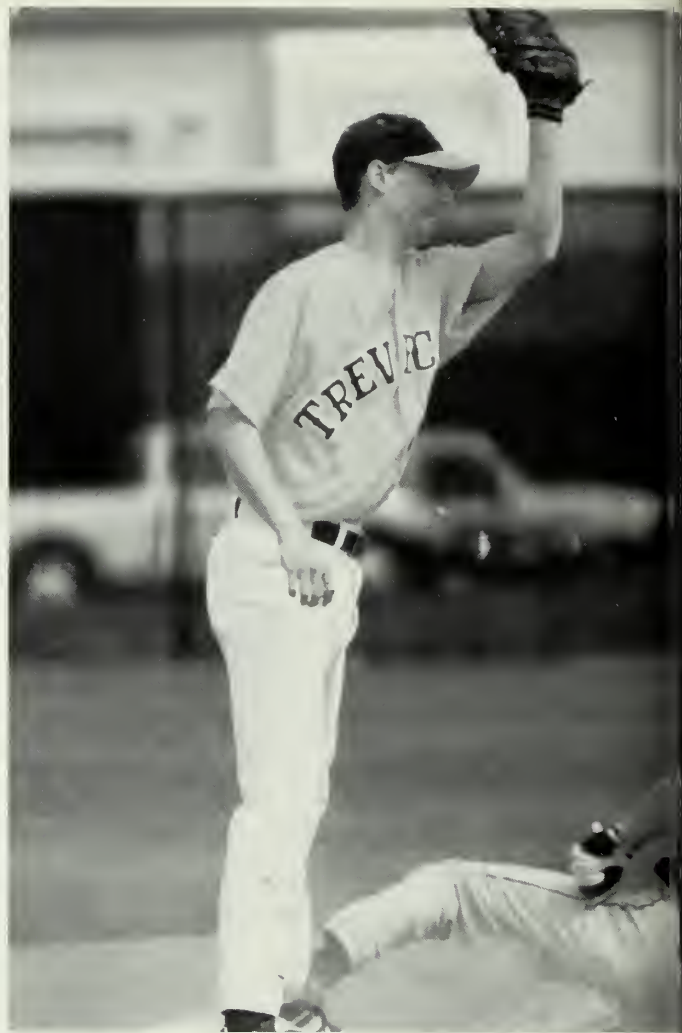

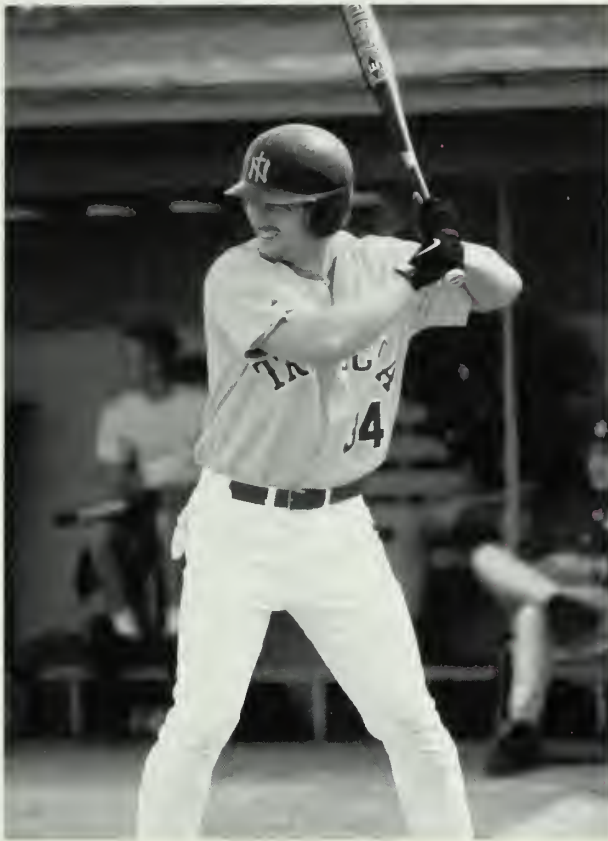

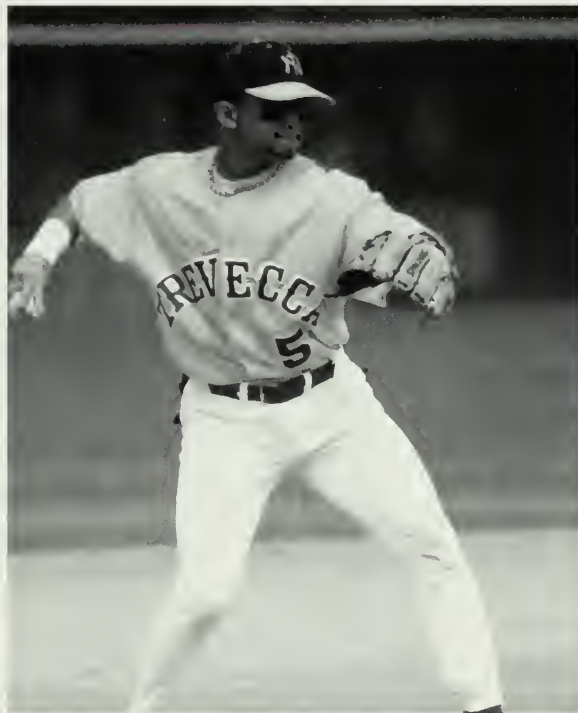

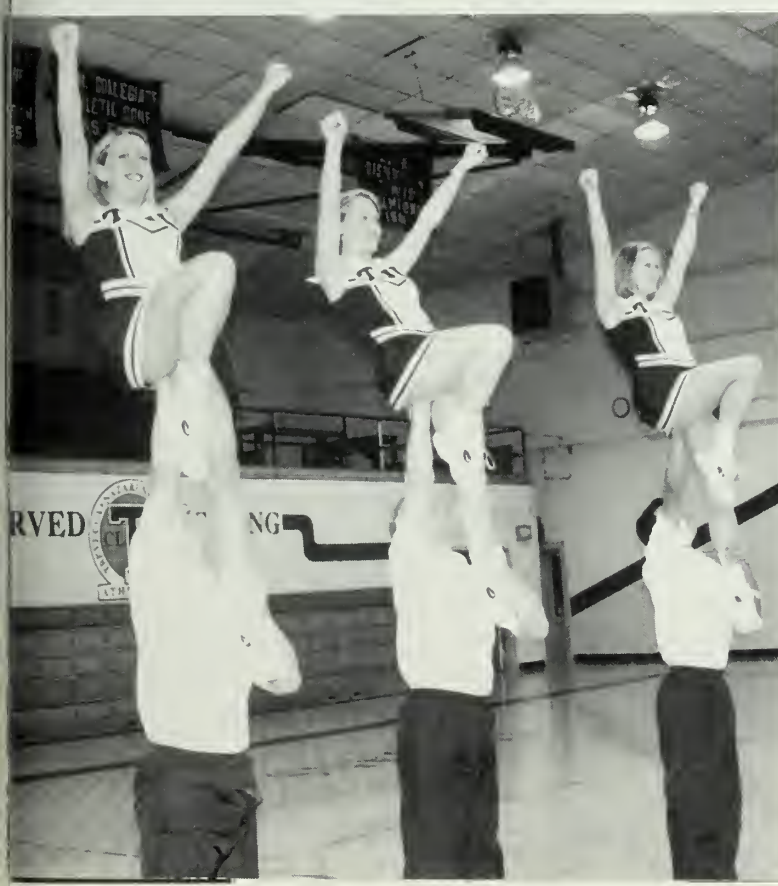

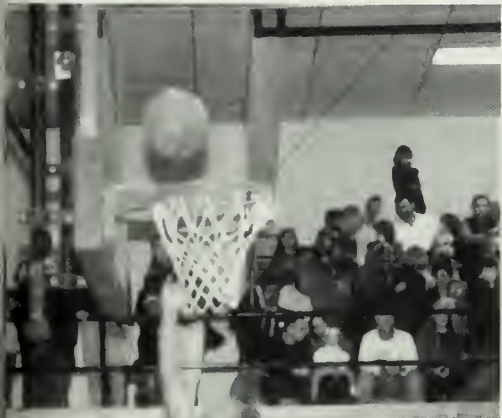

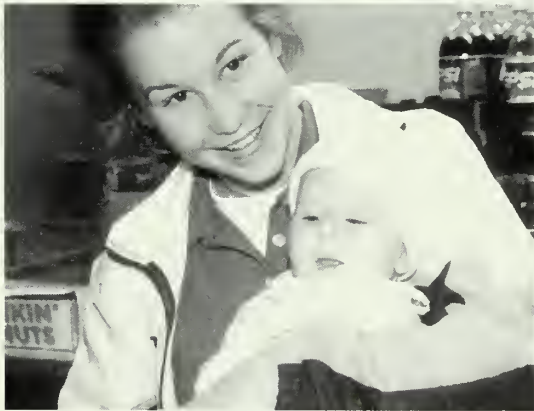

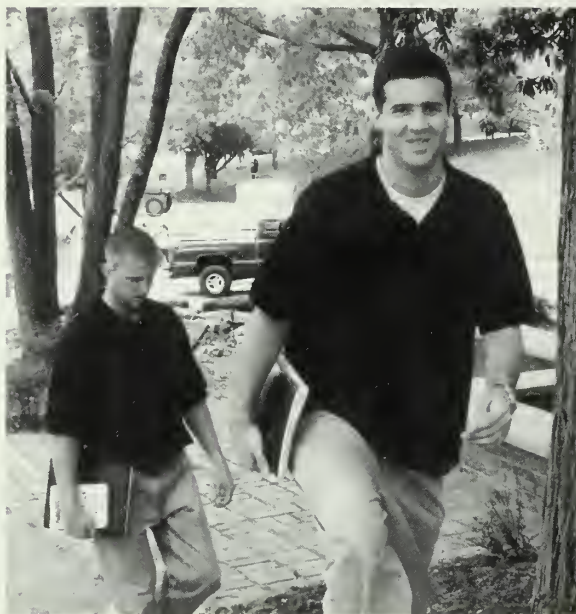

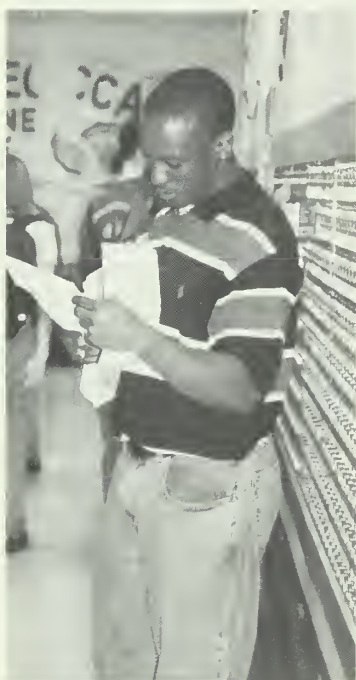

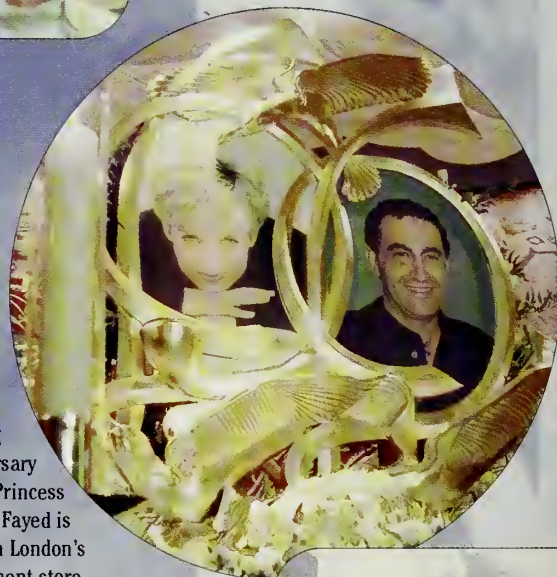

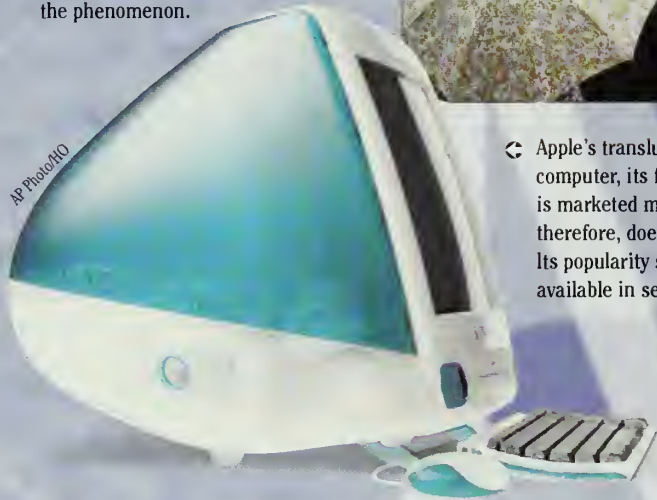

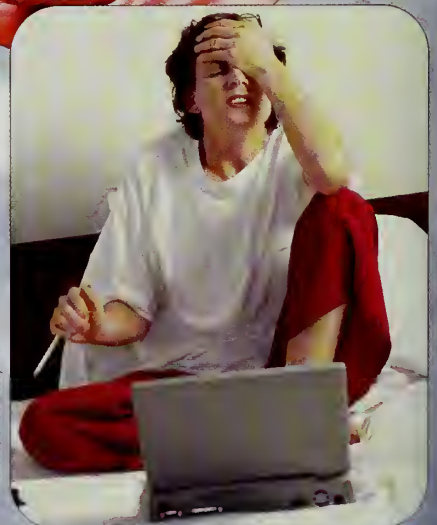

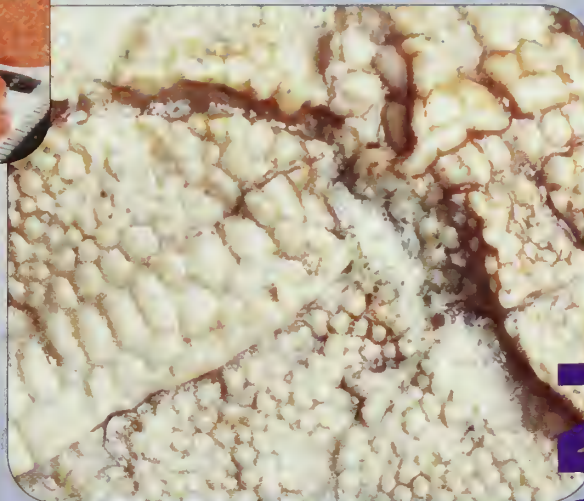

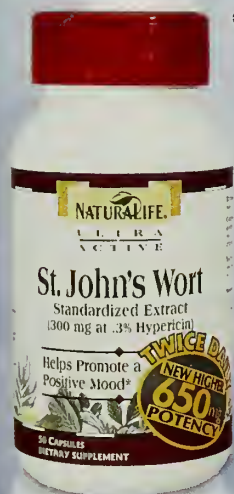

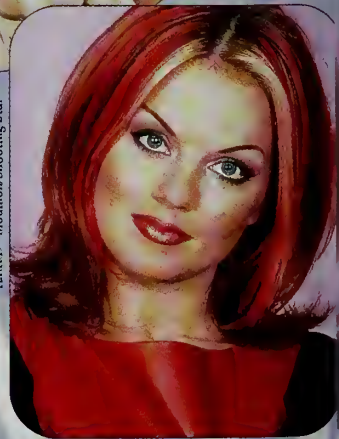

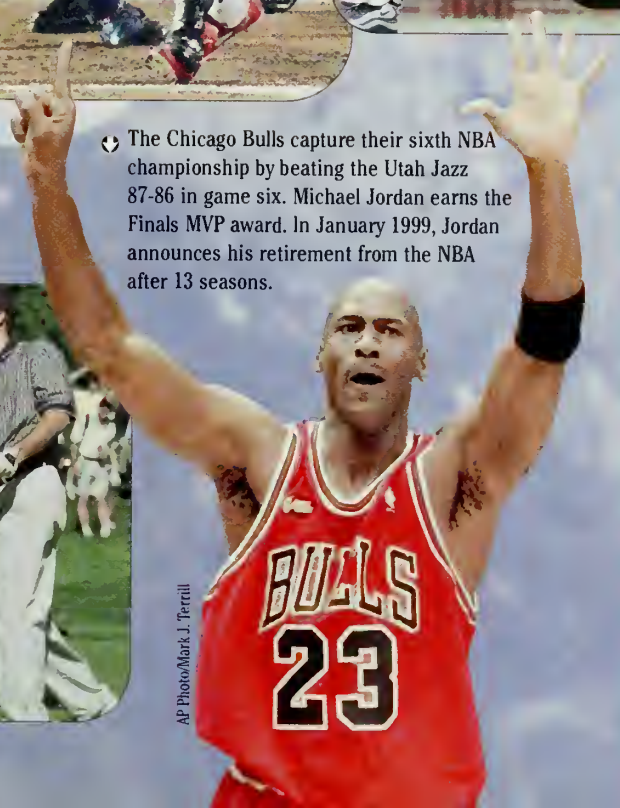

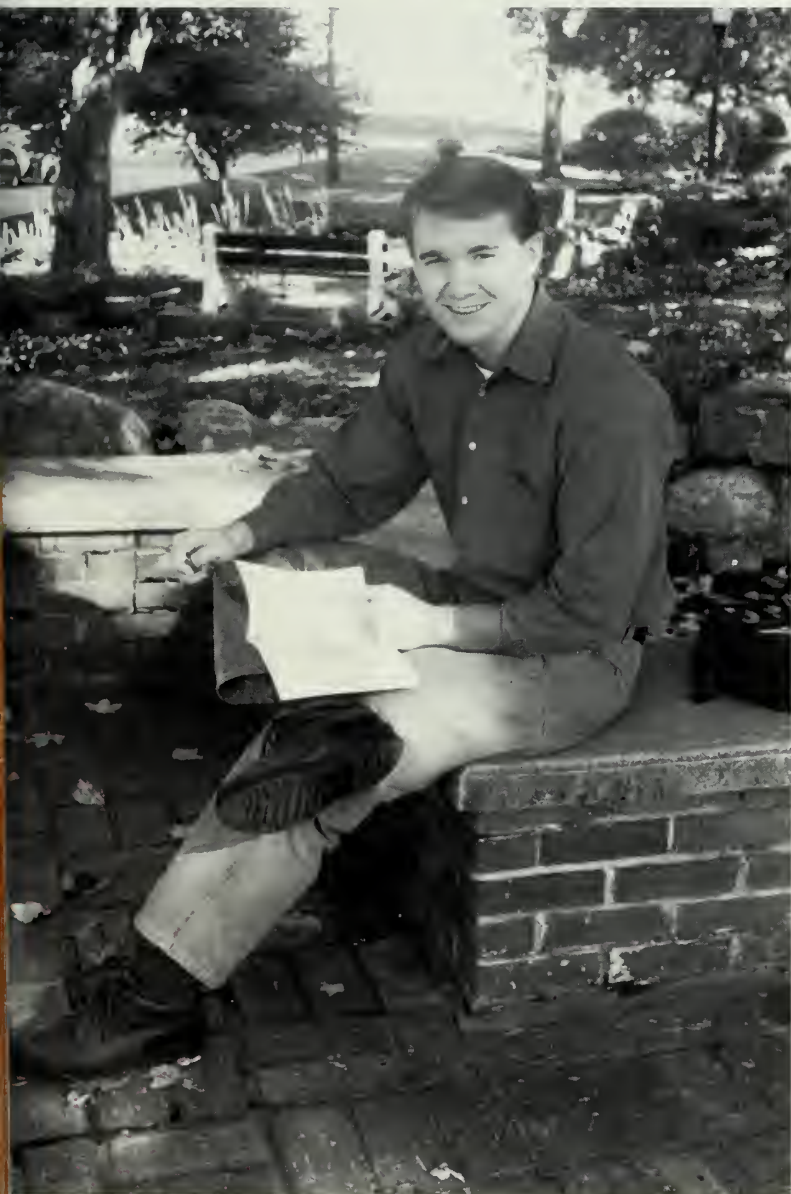

Volume number 75 of the Trevecca Nazarene University *Darda* was printed by Josten's Printing and Publishing Company located in Clarksville, Tennessee. A total of 650 books were printed. The cost of the book to students is covered in the general fee which the student pays at the beginning of each semester. Each student is entitled to a book if he or she has attended both the fall and spring semesters consecutively. Michael's Photography out of Smyrna, Tennessee, photographed all of the faculty, staff, administration, and student portraits. This 9x12 book features a craftline embossed cover in maroon with brushed gold stamping. The grain of the cover is brushstroke. The endsheets are ivory. The length of this publication is 184 pages, with 19 four-color pages, and 6 pages of spot color. The typeface used was Palatino. The lead-ins of the captions were set in 10-point font bold while the body of the captions was set in 9-point font. The Jostens representatives were Harold McGehee and Jason McGehee.
