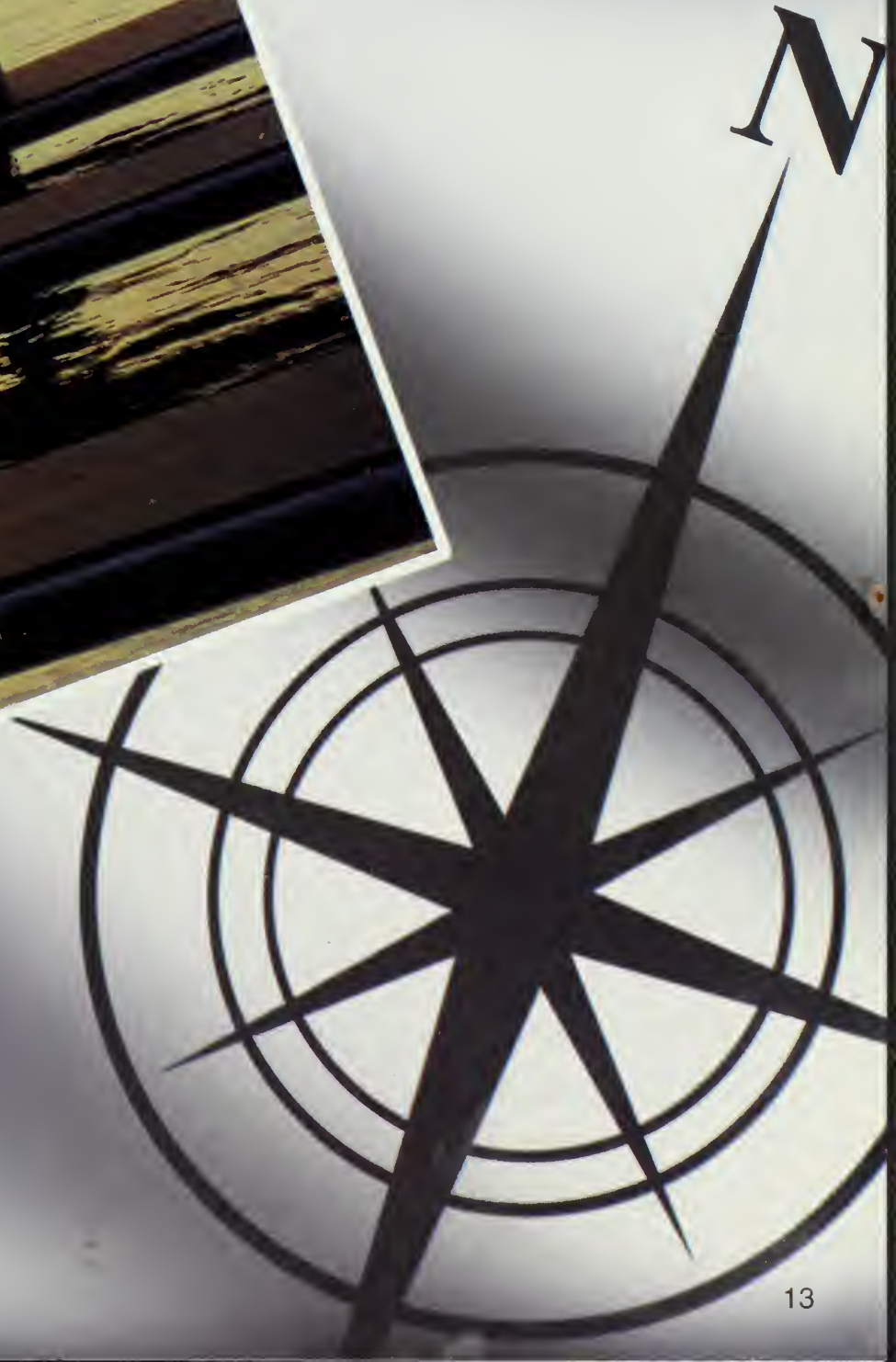

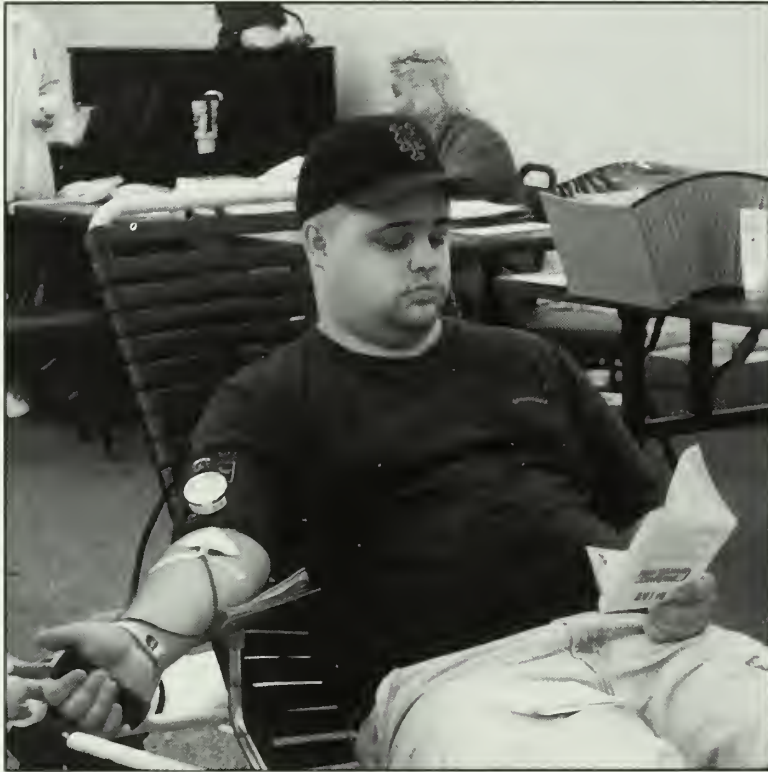

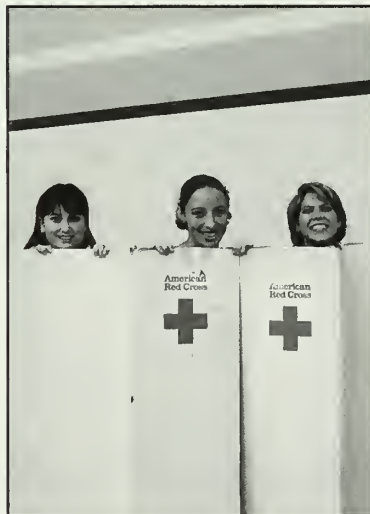

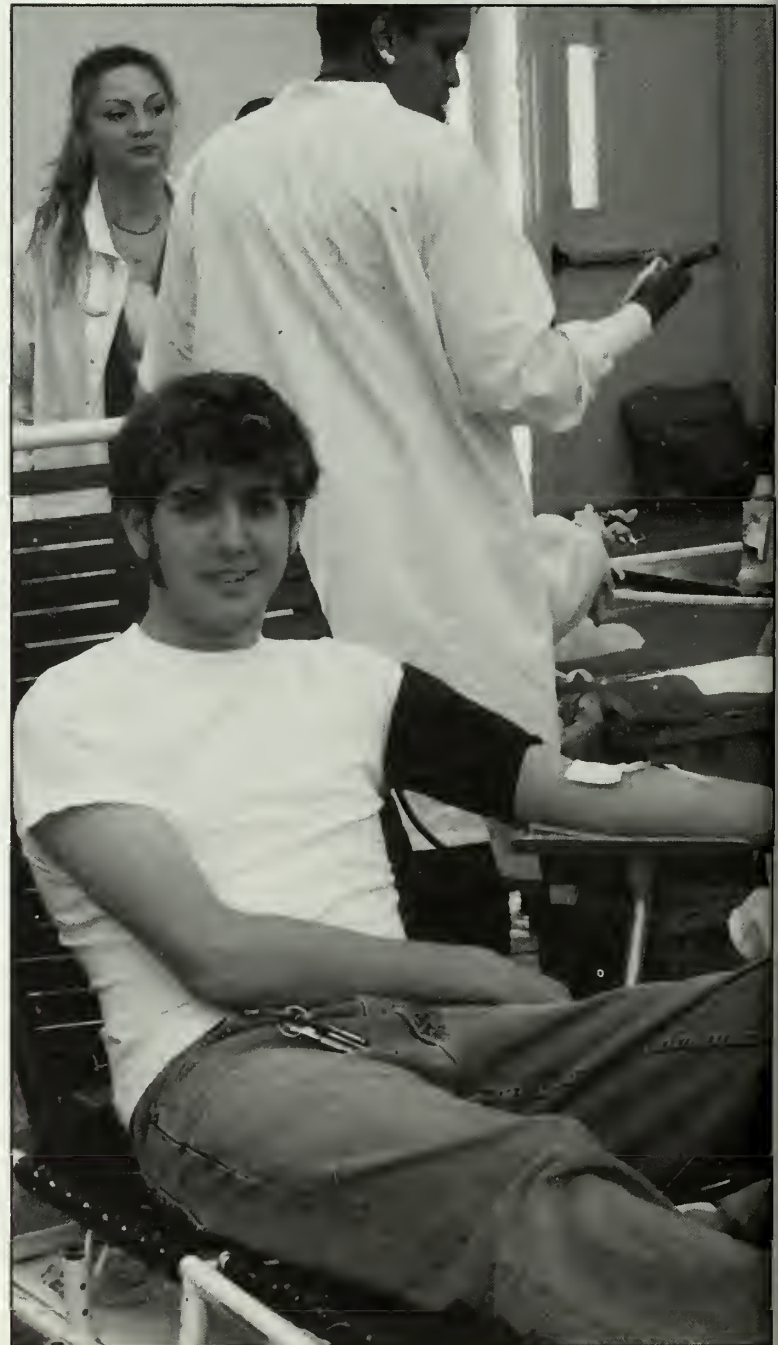

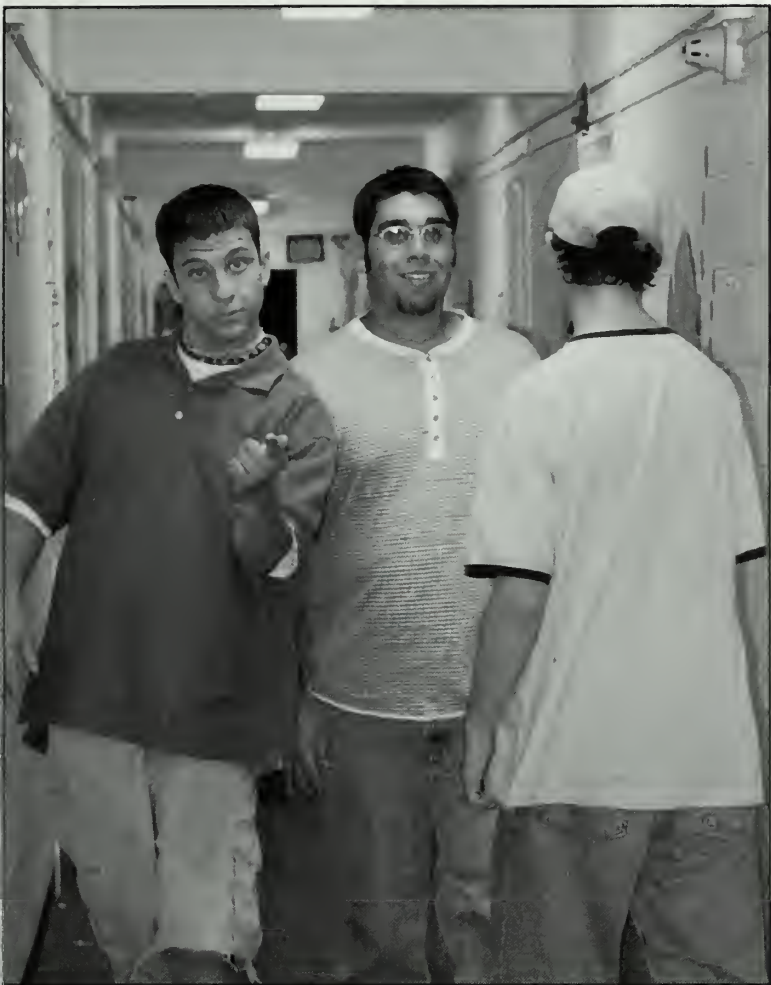

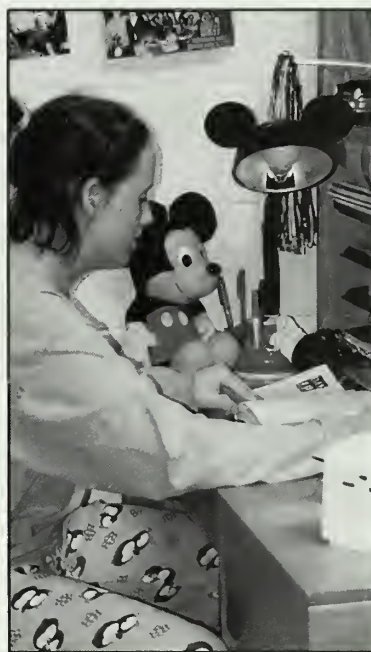

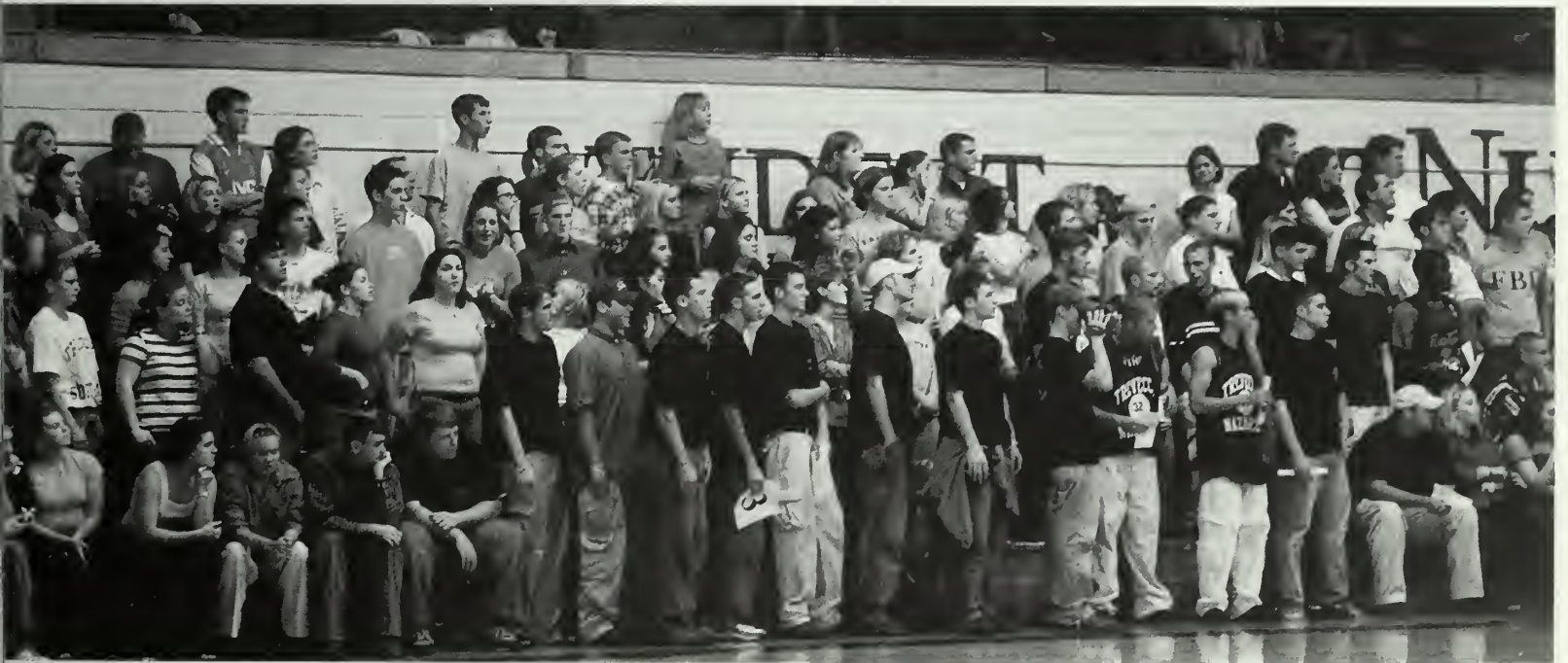

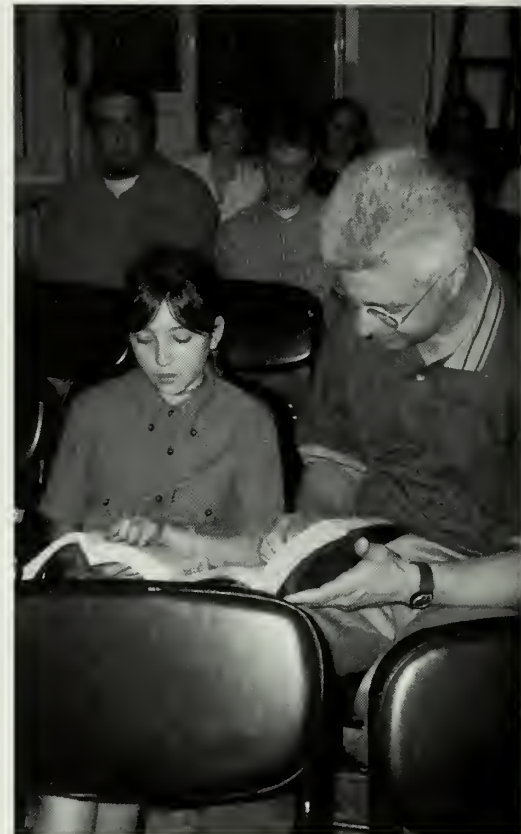

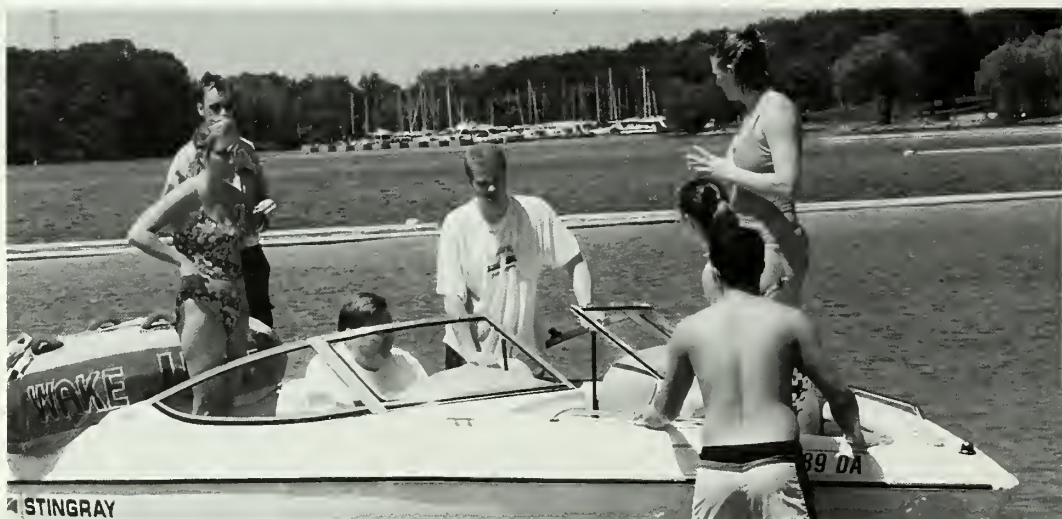

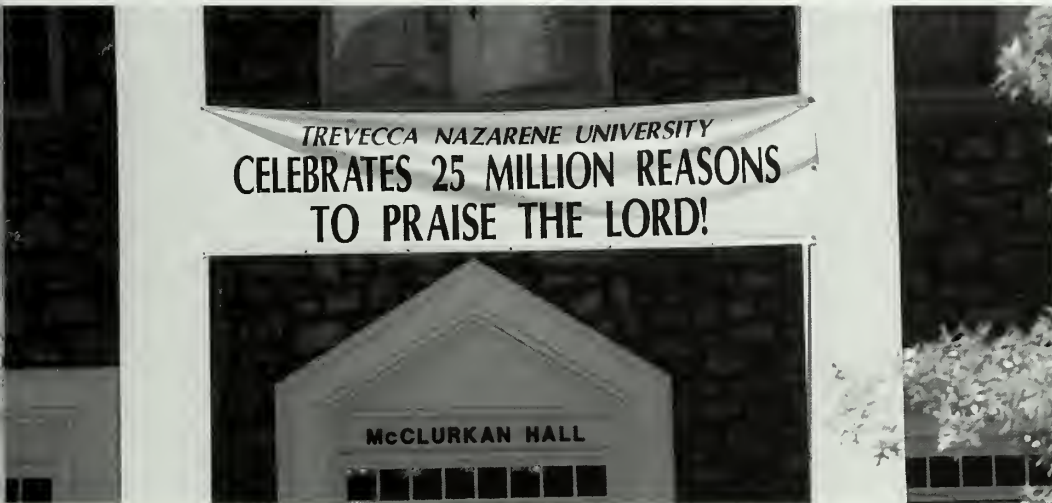

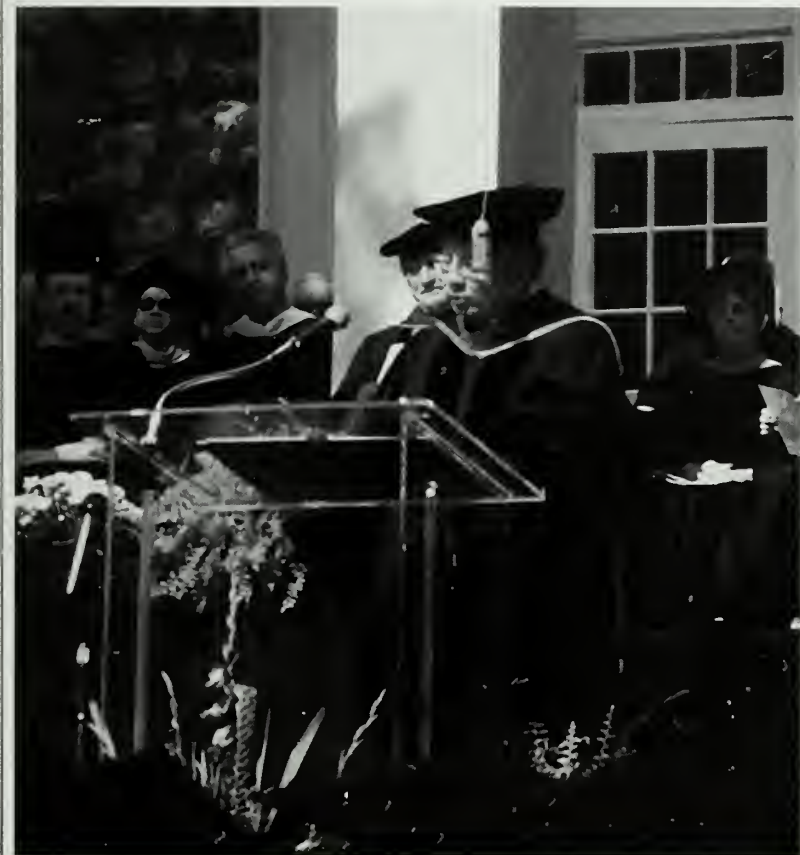

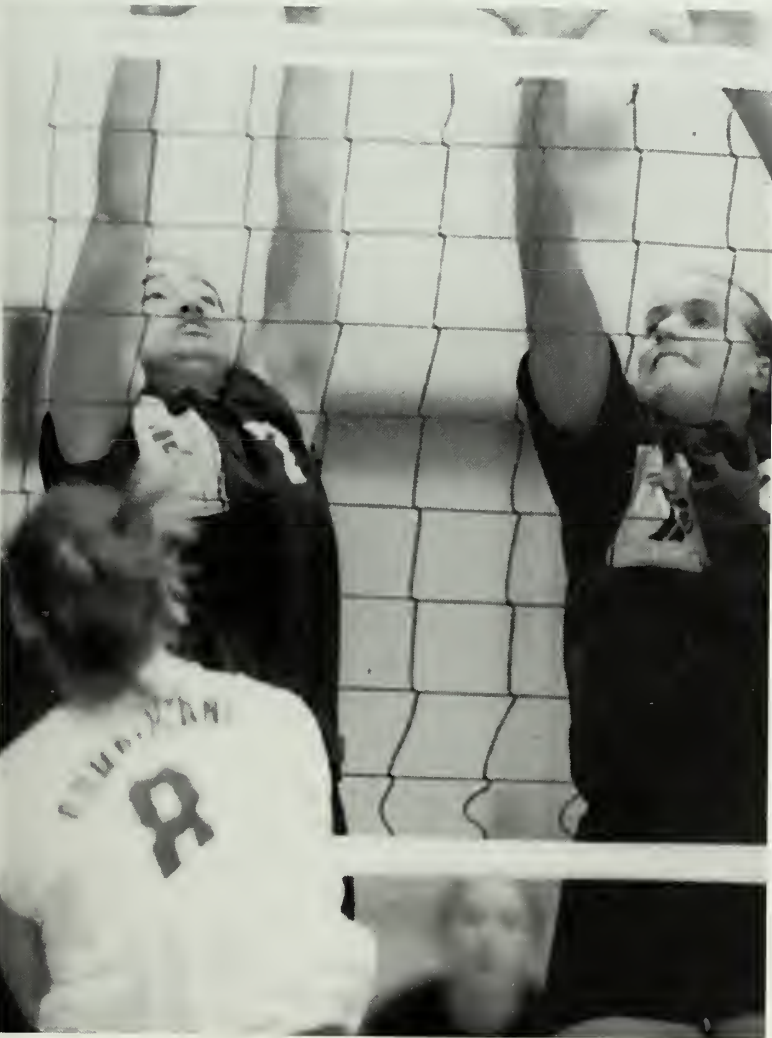

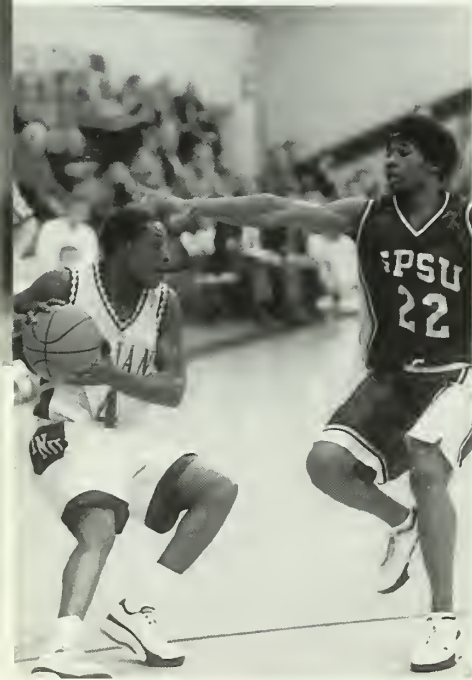
Men's Basketball

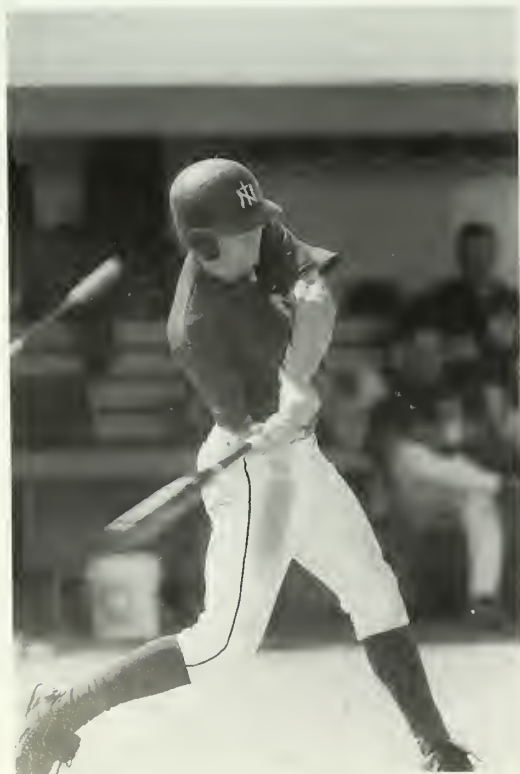

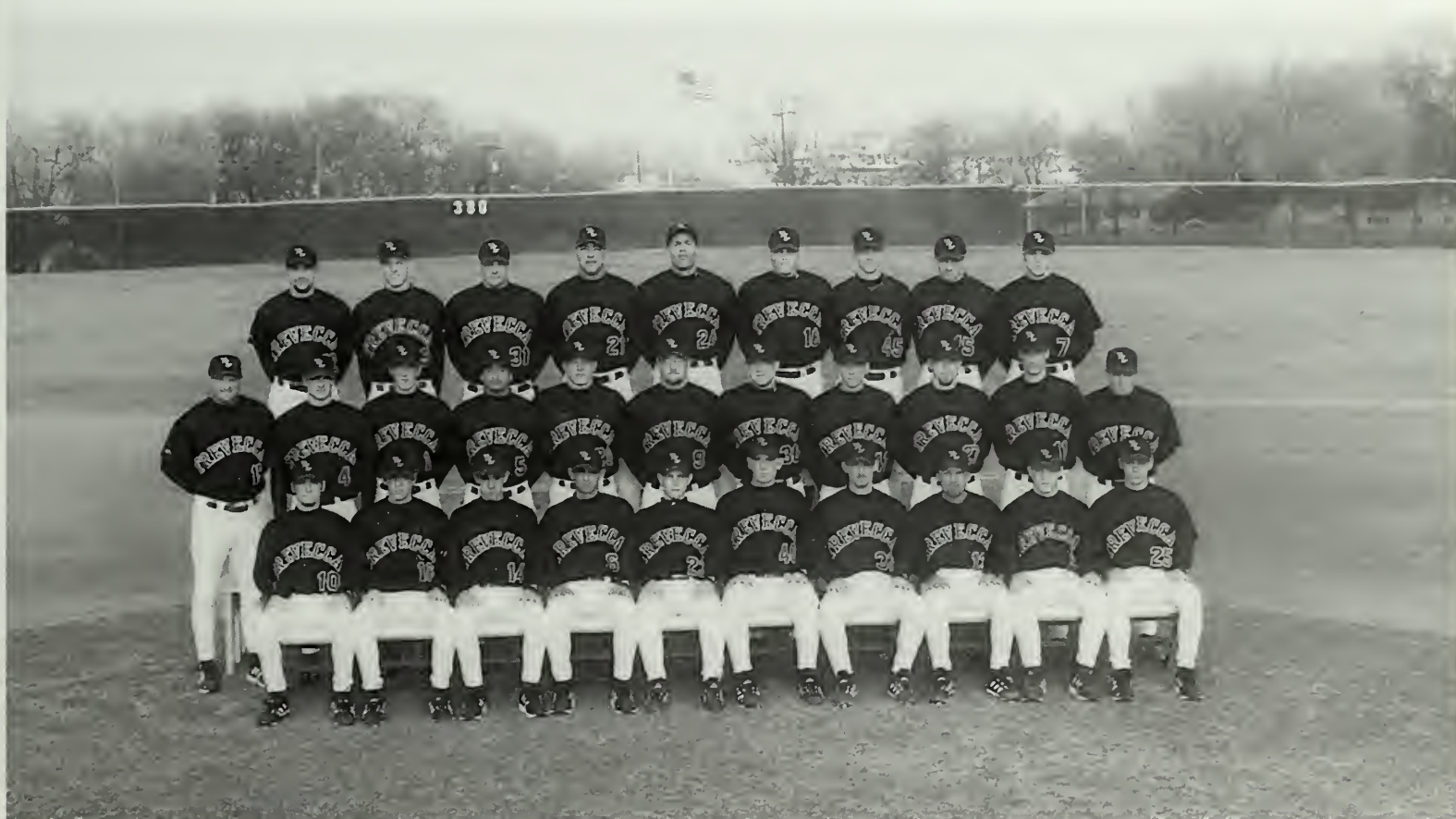

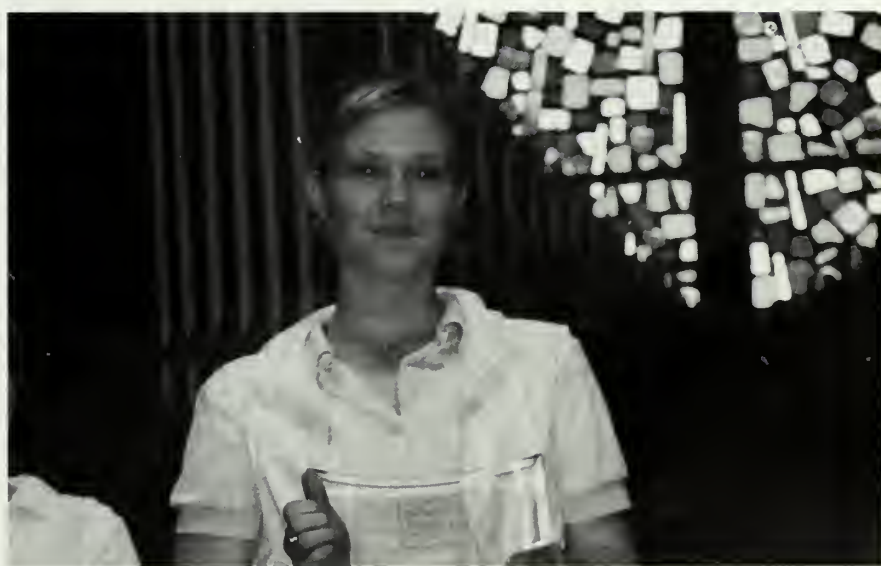
