## Record number of graduates in 2009

Trevecca's 2009 Commencement ceremonies took place or May 2, 2009, after a night of rain and a soggy start to the morning. When weather conditions appeared to be chang ing, administrators decided that conditions would-after all-permit the ceremonies to be held outdoors. With seating prepared for 6,700 persons, an outdoor ceremony allowed all family and friends of graduates to be able to be present.

Education professor Stella Simpson delivered the challenge to graduates, and responses came from three graduates: Matt Taylor, representing traditional undergraduates; Josh Carlson, representing degree-completion graduates; and Marvin Jones, representing graduate students.

Degrees were awarded to 872 graduates, a new Trevecca record. An honorary doctorate was presented to Steve Harris, associate provost and dean of student development, in recognition of his 30 years of service to Trevecca.

The Citizenship Award, the highest award presented to an undergraduate, was presented to Drew Vinson.

## Habitat For Humanity

Trevecca "helps to build houses and hope"


Trevecca students are always willing to lend a hand to projects that not only help others but also build relationships with people in the community. For the second year in a row Trevecca teamed up with Habitat for Humanity to build a house for a worthy family.
The students filled almost 100 volunteer roles at the construction sites during a period of four days.

Each day of work started at 7 AM and ended around 3 PM; the students contributed almost 800 hours of their time in order for a family to have a new home. The four days of labor equaled about half of the "build" days for the house. Also, students and faculty raised more than $\$ 500$ for sup-
plies, so Trevecca played a key role in the project's coming to fruition.

The parties involved in this kind of project share a special joy: the new home owner and family are overjoyed to receive the gift; the students who helped make the gift possible experience joy, also.


For most Trevecca students, spring break is a welcomed week of relaxation, which they spend at the beach or at home, catching up on much-needed sleep. For members of TAG, this year's break was an opportunity to serve and learn in Chicago. Daily TAG members worked three hours at Chase Elementary School, providing any services the school required. They helped in the same classes all week in order to give them opportunity to build relationships with the teachers and students. In the evenings they volunteered at different organizations. At Good News Soup Kitchen they served dimner and cleaned up afterward; at Chicago Food Depository they packed a thousand boxes of food to distribute; and at Emmaus Ministries, a ministry that works with male street prostitutes. TAG leaders conducted activities that immersed them in a community so that team members could learn about and understand the cultural groups in Chicago. One activity was a scavenger hunt that required students to learn about a community as part of the hunt. Also, eating at different ethnic restaurants was part of their immersion in other cultures.

Trevecca's women's soccer team faced a number of difficulties at the beginning of its season. The primary difficulty was the loss of experienced team members. "We had a very young team," explained Coach Brett Armstrong. "We had no seniors and 14 new players on the team; ten were freshman and four were transfers." With senior leadership absent and the majority of players new to the team and college life, Coach Armstrong knew that the first priority would be to build relationships between the returning players and the incoming ones. Training started in the summer, long before there were any signs of life on campus. Since the first objective was to connect as a team, the beginning of training consisted of team-building exercises, such as spending time at a ropes course and canoeing the Harpeth River together.

The relationships began to solidify and become stronger in competition. One of the biggest wins was in overtime against Cumberland, a victory which put the team in the TranSouth Conference Tournament. Playing in that tournament
had been a team goal from the beginning of the season. Injuries began to take a toll on the team, and Trevecca ended up losing to Lyon in the first round of the tournament. Next season they will bring their experience back to the field, where they "hope to build upon their work and success this next season."

With the volleyball season starting early in the new school year, the team kick started the beginning of the year, created excitement, and provided opportunities for students to show support. The team worked hard and reached third place in the TranSouth Conference (TSC) Tournament, but the road to that accomplishment required team members to overcome several obstacles and to work hard on several levels.

In July Coach Scott Jones, the most successful volleyball coach in Trevecca's history, died unexpectedly. The sudden death of their popular coach shocked team members and necessitated a quick search for a replacement who could be in place for pre-season training and could help the team recover from the loss of Jones.
