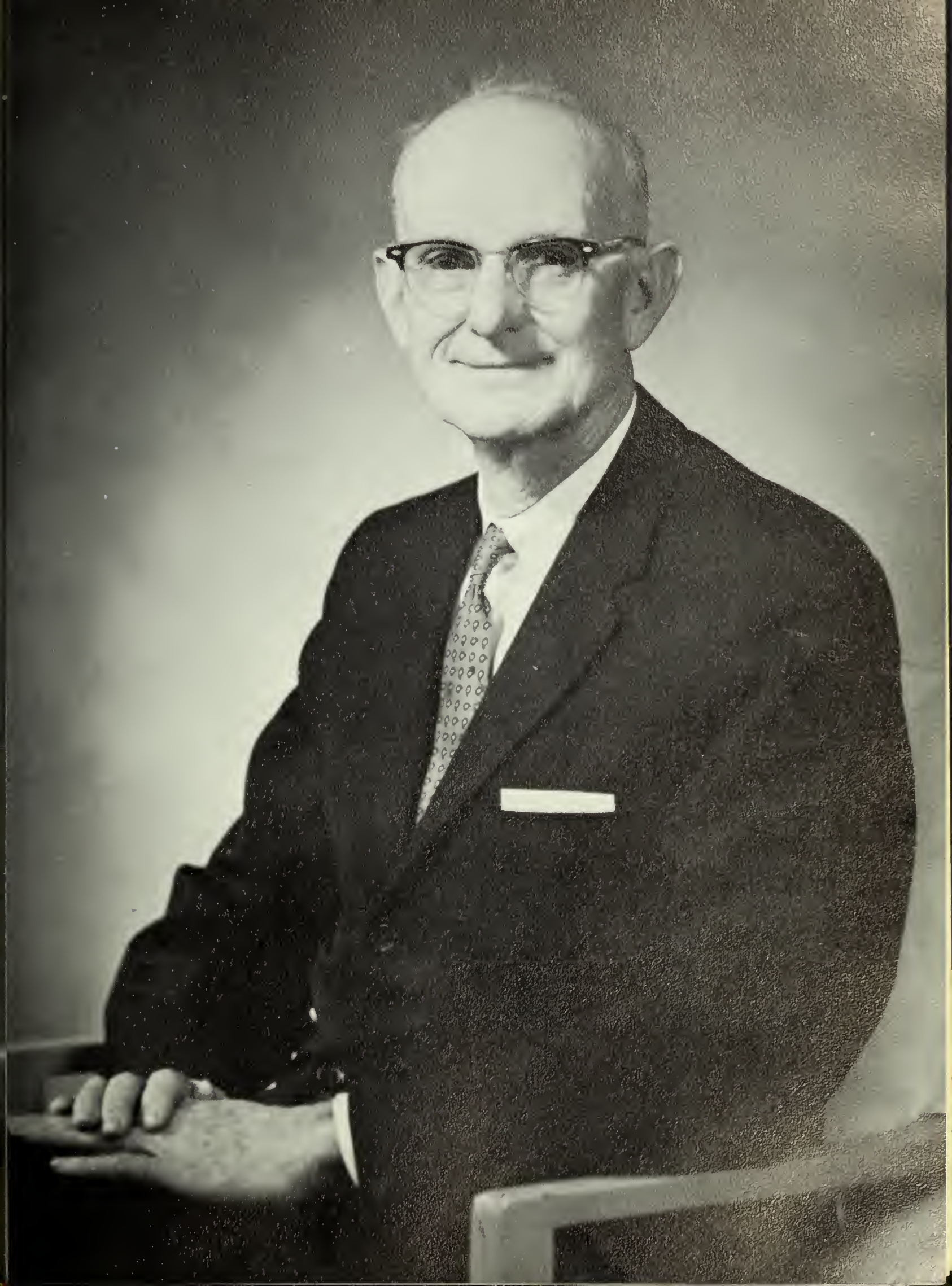


A Message from our president

The whole tree is simply a modification and development of the leaf, as it is most certainly the creation of the leaf. The leaf, therefore, represents the righteous man's life. Not only does he do good to others, but he gets good to himself. Godliness is to a man's nature what sunlight is to vegetation. It imparts freshness of living and unfading beauty. It is my hope and prayer that Trevecca students will live beautiful lives. The Psalmist says, "The Lord taketh pleasure in his people; he will beautify the meek with salvation." This is a beauty which can't be purchased at the beauty parlor or learned at the charm school. However, every person can be attractive; every man can be handsome, and every woman can be beautiful.
