arol Anne Eby graduated from revecca in 1956 with a speech major nd an English minor and then went cross town to George Peabody ollege for Teachers (now a part of anderbilt University) to earn a haster's degree in English. For one ear she taught speech, drama, and inglish to grades 9 through 12 at her Id high school, Boone County High a Florence, Kentucky. In that job she vorked alongside her former principal nd her former English teacher.
In 1958 she married Lee Eby, a revecca student whom she had asked or a date during a TWIRP week at revecca. They moved to Kansas City or him to attend Nazarene heological Seminary, and she taught peech at Pitcher Junior High School n Independence, Missouri.
In 1963 the Ebys traveled to Papua New Guinea to serve as missionaries or the Church of the Nazarene. That ear Mrs. Eby taught forty-eight first raders-quite an experience for omeone who had never taught young hildren. For the next eighteen years he taught at the Bible college in Papua New Guinea, homeschooling ler own four children all the time.
Mrs. Eby joined Trevecca's English aculty in 1982 and began making her resence felt on campus-with her varm smile, her kindness, and her lelicious cinnamon rolls-until she etired at the end of the 1999-2000 chool year.
Professor Eby, the 2000 Darda is ledicated to you in gratitude for your eaching and your Christian example.

## world events


$\triangle$ Russian President Boris Yeltsin shocked the world by resigning on New Year's Eve. He handed the reigns of power to Prime Ministe Vadimir Putin. In one of his first acts as President, Putin gave Yeltsin bodyguards, a pension, and immunity from prosecution.

$\triangle$ Alaska Airline Flight 261 crashed 11 miles off Point Mugu, California on January 31. All 88 people on board were killed.

$\Delta$ School violence continued to be a major concern. Since February of 1997, school shooting sprees left 36 dead and 77 wounded.


- Elian Gonzalez, a six-year-old refugee from Cuba was rescued after the boat carying him and his mother went down in the Atlantic Ocean. Elian's mother drowned on their journey and a huge controversy erupted over whether the boy should be allowed to stay in the United States with relatives, or returned to his father in Cuba.

$\triangle$ Russia came under international scrutiny for waging a civil war to try to hold on to the break-away republic of Chechnya. After months of fierce fighting neither side gained much ground, and a settlement seemed nowhere in sight.
$\Delta$ Six firefighters were killed in a December 3, Worchester, Massachusetts blaze started by squatters in a warehouse. More than 15,000 firefighters from all over the world sathered for a memorial senvice.

$\Delta$ Raisa Gorbachev, former first lady of the Soviet Union, died after a battle with leukemia.

$\Delta$ Ninety-year old Doris Haddock, also known as "Granny D," walked 3,000 miles across the U.S. to draw attention to campaisn finance reform.

$\triangle$ Greek deputy forejign minister Yiannos Kranidiotis was killed after the plane he was traveling in suddenly lost altitude on its way to Romania. Kranidiotis and his son were both reported dead.

"America's son" John F. Kennedy Jr, his wife Carolyn Bessette and her sister Lauren Bessette were killed when the plane John was piloting crashed into the ocean off the coast of Massachusetts.

$\triangle$ Over 17,000 people were killed and thousands more injured when a magnitude 7.4 earthquakè hit lzmit, Turke on August 17.


A Swizerland's Bertrand Piccard and Britain's Brian Jones travelled around the world in a balloon on a 20-day, 29,000 mile voyage. This was the first voyage of its kind to make it all the way around the world.


The San Diego Zoo was home to Hua Mei, the first surviving giant panda to be born in a North American zoo.

$\Delta$ The last solar eclipse of the century drew thousands of spectators around the world on August 11. A shadow cast by the moon turned day to night for those in a seventy mile wide path from England to India.

$\Delta$ The rain from Hurricane Floyd caused the worst flooding in North Carolina in recent memory. Water from the Tar and Neuse ivers covered 66 counties, destroying over 4,000 homes and killing 51 people.


$\triangle$ A November World Trade Organization conference in Seattle was disrupted by violent protesters claiming the WTO promoted larse, multinational corporations at the expense of workers' rishts and environmental concerns.

$\Delta$ A string of deadly tornados crossed the southwest, killing 47 people and damaging or destroying over 2,600 homes and businesses. Worst hit was the Oklahoma City area where over 50 tomados touched down.

$\Delta$ Peanuts creator, Charles Schulz, died in his sleep the night before his final comic strip ran in newspapers. He was 77.
