


Trevecca's New President Dr. Dan Boone

A yearbook is filled with faces. The popular version on the Web is called "facebook." Years from now your memory will get fuzzy on the names, but you won't forget that face. So you browse this book looking for those familiar faces that bring a smile and hoping to see your own in a place or two.

I find it strange that in a yearbook filled with faces, the theme is "Hands On." I'm wondering why we didn't photograph everyone's hands instead of their faces. Could you recognize your friends by looking at their hands? One of my favorite biblical narratives is the story of Jesus walking on the road to Emmaus with two disciples. It is the weekend of crucifixion and resurrection, but the two disciples don't know about the resurrection. Jesus is now in their "deceased facebook." As he walks with them, they don't recognize him. He is not a stranger, but they do not recognize him by his face. We don't know why. They walk and talk. They invite Jesus to stay for supper. His hands come to the center of the table, break the bread, and then pass it to the two friends. Their eyes are opened, and they recognize the risen Jesus. A little later in the same story Jesus appears in the middle of a room filled with disciples. They also do not recognize him. So he shows them his hands. These are hands that worked in a carpenter's shop, touched





lepers, hoisted children into the air, scrubbed dirty feet, broke bread, and were spiked to a cross. When they saw the hands, they knew it was Jesus.

Our hands reveal us. Sherlock Holmes, the famous literary detective, could shake hands and discern a person's work, social standing, family status, and hobbies. Hands speak. As a child, I would sit in church and look at my father's hands. They had milked cows, picked cotton, fought a war, raised a family, overhauled engines, and patted babies to sleep. Dad's history is in his hands. Mine is too.

Trevecca received a gift this year. The statue of the foot-washing Jesus stands in Trevecca's roundabout. Jesus' hands are well crafted by artist/sculptor Scott Stearman. The statue reminds us daily that Christians are known as the followers of Jesus by what we do with our hands. Trevecca students are marked by "hands-on" spirituality. We believe that God came to us with the human hands of Jesus. We also believe that we are sent into the world to be the human hands of Jesus. So as you browse this book, the faces will be familiar, but the hands reveal us. History is what we do with our hands.

Because "hands on" is such an appropriate description for Chaplain Tim Green, the decision about the yearbook dedication was easily made. Chaplain Green's contributions in many areas of life at Trevecca Nazarene University reveal that he is a hands-on person. Teaching, leading chapel, participating in annual Trevecca Around the Globe (TAG) trips, serving the denomination, and publishing—he is involved. Additionally, he models leadership—academically and spiritually—for students.

His life is evidence of his dedication to his calling. He graduated from Olivet Nazarene University (major in religion/minor in Greek) and from Vanderbilt University (M.A. and Ph.D.—Old Testament studies). Along the way he was ordained and served on the staffs of three Churches of the Nazarene—Hendersonville (TN), Springdale (OH), and Nashville Grace.

In 1991 he became a full-time member of the Trevecca religion faculty. His responsibilities at Trevecca grew through the years—chaplain, chair of the Division of Religion and Philosophy, and finally dean of the School of Religion. He finds time to minister at denominational events, on the campuses of other Nazarene universities and schools, and in foreign countries. His hands-on life is appreciated at Trevecca.

-Scott Stearman crafted it in his studio in Green Mountain Falls, Colorado.

-Weight: 300-350 lbs.

-Height: (From base to top)16 feet -Design took about 6 months, with an additional 3 months for casting. -The actual statue is 6 feet tall. -The sculpture is made out of solid bronze.




"The year Jesus came to Trevecca"

The hard work and effort of the TNU Alumni Association Board of Directors paid off when the Jesus statue arrived on campus. After much anticipation the 6' bronze statue of Jesus was put into place on September 20, 2005. The event marked a momentous day in the history of Trevecca's campus. The statue was dedicated on November 4, 2005, as part of the Homecoming Week festivities. The base of the roundabout is inscribed with a passage taken from John 13:14-15. The verses states, "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you." The statue with its inscription stands as a visible reminder to the Trevecca Community of Trevecca's mission to produce servant-leaders.














