





Prologue From The President

he Trevecca campus has been home to diverse occupants. The hill we call sacred ground has served as a Catholic home for orphaned children, an asylum for the mentally ill, a college for African-American students, the home of a prominent Nashville judge, and the site of a Union Army encampment during the Civil War. When Trevecca lost the campus on the east side of Nashville, President A. B. Mackey and a few friends chopped their way through the weeds of an overgrown hilltop to claim this ground for the purposes of Christian higher education. Today Trevecca enjoys a vista of downtown Nashville that is mysteriously inviting.

I wonder about those persons who lived on this hill before Trevecca took ownership of it. How many homeless children sat on this hilltop looking into downtown Nashville, dreaming of a future? How many troubled adult patients walked this ground trying to find sanity somewhere beneath their feet? How many sons and daughters of slaves began an educational journey in a culture that deprived them of the benefits of academia? How many legal cases that judge pondered while strolling the hilltop? How many soldiers far from home bedded down beside campfires while hoping for peace in a divided nation. This hilltop is not without history. This hill and its inhabitants have been looking out over Nashville for a long time.

This yearbook prominently features Trevecca's location in Nashville. Trevecca's founder, J.O. McClurkan, was one of Nashville's leading citizens. He was known for his social concern. From its inception, Trevecca has been interested in the city. Having occupied a reclaimed church on the east bank of the Cumberland River, historic buildings in the shadow of the state capitol and the Ryman Auditorium, a former governor's home on Gallatin Pike, and the current campus, Trevecca has always been deeply concerned for and deeply connected to Nashville. Trevecca has cared for Nashville's poor, her homeless, her hungry, her sick, her uneducated, her prisoners, her lost. Today is no different. We believe that God calls us, equips us for service, and gives us to the world as a sign of his gracious love.

As you browse the pages of this book, you will see faces. What you may not see is that the city of Nashville has been made a better place by these people, the people of Trevecca Nazarene University. It is my hope that this pictorial journal of a year in the Trevecca story will open your eyes to the great good being done in a great city by a people who exist to be rather than to seem.


















students. The messages tackled issues that were relevan to the students' lives and helped them grow and develop their faith.


































Resident Hall Association
